28th Linville to Blackbutt - The Bribane valley rail trail

Start time is 6am sharp! Distance is 23kms each way.

Grade: Gradual climb to Benarkin then level to Blackbutt - return journey is mostly effortless save for swerving around the odd cow and a few rocks.

Equipment: Modern wheels or old irons - chose your weapon!

BYO: food, water, sunscreen & protective clothing!

Some of us will be camping at Linville on the Sunday afternoon (there is a nice spot beside the historic railway station (free). All welcome to camp otherwise join us early Monday morning.

and Kenilworth cycle foray

9.30 am start Route: Crystal Waters Markets to Kenilworth Hotel and return (approx 60klm). In the spirit of adventurous cycling tradition a foray is proposed for all interested on their 'Ordinary/Penny Farthing' cycles. Other bicycles welcome of course!

Riders should be confident with traffic, medium to high fitness to complete whole distance, or arrange a support vehicle from the midway point.

Topography is moderate rolling undulations to flat with exception of the entry into Kenilworth. About 5km before Kenilworth there are steep curving declines where riders are warned of a 1-2km dismount-walk interruption before remounting and riding into Kenilworth.

Departure: Crystal Waters Markets located Kilcoy Lane off Ahern's Rd Sunshine Coast.

How to get to start point: Travelling from Brisbane, take Steve Irwin Way to Beerwah, take Kilcoy-Beerwah Rd then Kilcoy-Peachester Rd, Booroobin Rd, Scotts Rd, Maleny Stanley River Rd and then Postman's Track WARNING VERY STEEP DECENT. Right Ahern's Rd, left Kilcoy Lane (For best results, consult a decent map).

Alternatively from Woodford, take Kilcoy-Beerwah Rd, Booroobin Rd, Scotts Rd, Maleny Stanley River Rd and then Postman's Track WARNING VERY STEEP DECENT. Right Ahern's Rd, left Kilcoy Lane (again, a good map will be of value).

Alternatively take the Maleny-Kenilworth Rd from Maleny via Witta. Left into Ahern's Rd just prior to Conondale, right into Kilcoy lane.

Riders may wish to camp at the Crystal Waters camping site for opportunity to visit the markets on the Saturday morning. http://crystalwaters.org.au/ (Held first Saturday of each month). 
Terry Kay's bike museum is apparently open in Gympie! Wonderful news, stay tuned in the next edition for confirmation and details.

A snapshot from history ~ by Brian Rough

This parade in June 1900 was held to celebrate the Relief of Mafeking*. Everyone dressed up including the bicycle club who are in this accompanying photograph.

Here's what the Brisbane Courier said about them: "The bicycle clubs made a great display, wheeling in perfect time and keeping their lines splendidly. The wheels and hubs of all the machines were brilliantly lighted, and as this part of the procession passed the great crowds it evoked the heartiest applause. Quaint representations of Kruger's railway carriage, "Long Tom," and pom poms lent realism and variety to the affair. The Brisbane Bicycle Club, who won the trophy for the best display, had a representation of an armoured train, which belched out fire and smoke in a very realistic manner."

* The **Relief of Mafeking** refers to the conclusion of the Siege of the town of Mafeking, a pivotal action in the Second Boer War. The lifting of the siege was a decisive victory for the British. [Ed]
